On your syllabus you will find a section called "Freshman Focus Activities," and specifically a bullet point that reads as follows:

These writings should meet the standards of college-level writing, and you may elect to expand any of these pieces for your Final Portfolio in lieu of or in addition to Paper 1 and Paper 2.

Note that while you must attend and write about four of these activities for class, you should take advantage of as many others that sound interesting to you. One of the best things about college is the availability of high quality intellectual activities...for free!
